Northeast South Dakota

Bitter & Waubay Lakes are doing fair on walleye, but good quality. Not a lot of word on the other lakes. White bass are biting on the Grenville grade. Blue Dog is seeing some boat traffic.

Lake Traverse

Lake Traverse continues to produce quality fish of all species. Walleye numbers are excellent. Bass, crappie, bluegill, catfish and northern are common. Quality perch are also on the rise. Both live and artificial baits are producing a nice mixed bag. – Wing N Fin Resort

We had a good Free Fishing weekend at the lodge although most of our activity was on Waubay. Lynn didn't see a lot of activity. The wind was a challenge this last weekend, but if you were able to get on the lake, you could find your walleyes. – Lynn Lake Lodge

The following report is provided by the SD Game, Fish & Parks:

Bitter Lake

Several boats tried the SE portion of the lake with some success catching walleye. Most anglers were pitching jigs into shallower water.

Dry Lake #1 (Clark County)

Not a lot of angler activity due to past weather. Fishing has slowed down.

Dry Lake #2 (Clark County)

Anglers have been having better success off shore wader fishing. Boat anglers have had little success. It appears morning and evening is definitely a better bite.

Goose Lake

A few nice walleye are being caught; mornings and evenings continue to be the best times.

Hazelden

Minimal pressure but a few anglers did catch some keeper walleye this past weekend.

Indian Springs

Fishing has slowed due to weather patterns. A few smaller fish are being caught out of boats.

James River

Anglers have been catching a few walleye and catfish. The bite has been slow, so far. Anglers are having better luck in the evenings fishing.

Lake Albert

No report this week.

Lake Kampeska

Fishermen are still catching a variety of fish. The walleye being caught are primarily less than 15 inches, with a few nicer fish being caught. White bass are starting to bite, along with a few crappies.

Lake Pelican

Fishermen are still catching a few walleye, with the majority of the fish being less than 15 inches. The best fishing has been in the evenings.

Lake Poinsett

The fishing pressure continues to remain along the shore in the evenings and mornings. Success rates during those times can be fair.

Opitz Lake

Anglers fishing off shore have caught some smaller walleye utilizing a jig and minnow or a crappie rig. The boat anglers had decent luck fishing main lake points pulling bottom bouncers and crawlers.

Richmond

Anglers have been catching a few bullheads and walleye. The water is still a little too cold for the bluegill and crappie to start biting.

Roy Lake

Some really nice pike have been caught in the shallow bays near timber. A few walleye have also been caught using a jig and a minnow.

Waubay Lake

Anglers struggled this past weekend with the cooler temperatures and high winds. Anglers who chose to shore fish had better luck catching white bass, while boat anglers did pick up a few walleye.
